### Youth Re-engagement Drop-in Center in Wheaton

Wheaton, MD – On June 22, the Montgomery County Collaboration Council, through MoCo ReConnect, celebrated the ribbon cutting of the new Youth Re-engagement Drop-in Center. Speakers included Montgomery County Council Vice President **Evan Glass**; Montgomery County Council President **Gabe Albornoz**; Executive Director, Montgomery County Collaboration Council, **Elijah Wheeler**; Chief of Services to End and Prevent Homelessness, DHHS **Amanda Harris**; Project Director, Montgomery County Collaboration Council, **Alycia Chuney**; and youth speaker, **Myeisha Garns**. The initial sponsors include **The David and Mikel Blair Family Foundation**, **Foundation Housing**, and **BETAH Associates**.

The MoCo ReConnect Drop-in Center is a unique approach in Montgomery County as the only dedicated youth space specifically centering the needs of youth ages 16-24; particularly those impacted by housing insecurity and homelessness, and those seeking meaningful employment and educational opportunities. MoCo ReConnect values youth as decision-makers in the design of the space and programming through the Youth Action Board.

As Alycia Chuney, Project Director at Montgomery County Collaboration Council, explained: "What's so exciting about the center is that it brings together a collaboration of agencies providing outreach, case management, education, housing assistance, and employment training for the first time, all under one roof."

Recognizing that Black, Latinx, and LGBTQIA+ young people are disproportionately impacted by systems that lead to disconnection from school and/or homelessness, the Collaboration Council, through MoCo ReConnect, ensures that providers offer culturally relevant programming and LGBTQIA service navigators, as well as access to laundry rooms, showers, and hot meals to create a safe and welcoming space for all. Informed and co-designed by community partners and a youth advisory board, the Drop-in Center is an entry point for the Montgomery County Continuum of Care.

"This is what Montgomery County is all about. It's about the fabric of our social safety net -- making sure that every organization, whether it's Collaboration Council or LAYC, and so many others, have a part to play in this," said Evan Glass, Council Vice President, who celebrated the event as part of his Pride Month activities.

The Montgomery County Collaboration Council is a 501(c)3 organization established in 1992 under Maryland State law and serves as the Local Management Board in Montgomery County. The Collaboration Council is a catalyst and nonpartisan broker of public and private funds, established to lead partnerships that support county youth and family programs and initiatives.
